#### **GOALS**


Advance the academic achievement of all students by achieving Individual Education Plan goals in the area of ELA and Math.

# **SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS**


- HJS embraces the vision that all students can develop the skills necessary to becoming participating members of their communities.
- The average daily attendance was consistently 90%.
- 100% of the entire student body population maintained or progressed one or more phases on the Picture Exchange Communication System.
- Student behaviors have noticeably decreased as a result of the school-wide communicate initiative and effective teaching strategies.
- Students were afforded over 70 transition experiences, to include work experiences and community-based instruction.
- HJS received almost \$35,000.00 in donations to support classroom and community instruction as well as school activities.
- HJS maintained high breakfast participation as part of the Senate Bill 503 program.

#### **ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT / PROFICIENCY**


#### **CRITERION-REFERENCED TEST (CRT) PROFICIENCY**

#### HIGH SCHOOL READINESS


Nevada Administrative Code (NAC-389.445) requires that students in Grade 8 earn 1.5 credits in English, 1.5 credits in mathematics, 1 credit in science, and 1 credit in social studies with passing grades in order to matriculate to Grade 9. High school readiness is the percent of Grade 8 students meeting the requirements at this school.




#### STUDENT GROWTH

#### **CRT Growth**

When reporting student growth in percentiles, Median Growth Percentile (MGP) is the midpoint value of the schools' distribution of student growth percentiles.



Median Growth Percentile



Adequate Growth Percentile (AGP) measures the percentage of students that have demonstrated the growth performance necessary to become proficient, or to remain proficient, in three years or by the end of eighth grade, whichever comes first. A student's adequate growth percentile can range from 1 to 99.

# **ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY**

The English Language Proficiency measures the percentage of English Language Learners that have demonstrated adequate growth on the English language assessment to become proficient in English within five years or by Grade 12.
