GOALS


Advance the academic achievement of all students by achieving Individual Education Plan goals in the area of ELA and Math.

CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM

SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

- HJS embraces the vision that all students can develop the skills necessary to becoming participating members of their communities.
- The average daily attendance was consistently 90%.
- 100% of the entire student body population maintained or progressed one or more phases on the Picture Exchange Communication System.
- Student behaviors have noticeably decreased as a result of the school-wide communicate initiative and effective teaching strategies.
- Students were afforded over 70 transition experiences, to include work experiences and community-based instruction.
- HJS received almost \$35,000.00 in donations to support classroom and community instruction as well as school activities.
- HJS maintained high breakfast participation as part of the Senate Bill 503 program.
- 100% of the reportable students participated in the state-required Nevada Alternate Assessment (NAA).



The English Language Proficiency measures the percentage of English Language Learners that have demonstrated adequate growth on the English language assessment to become proficient in English within five years or by Grade 12.



GRADUATION RATE


